# 25/25. DECLARATIONS OF PECUNIARY INTEREST, ETC:

There were no declarations of interest.

#### 26/25. POLICE REPORT:

PCSO A. Stone informed Council there had been no crimes reported since her last update, however instances of rural crime are increasing, particularly lamping, damage to crops and theft of agricultural equipment. PCSO Stone asked members to report suspicious behaviour as soon as possible, but not to approach individuals, who may be dangerous. PCSO Stone reported there is an ongoing shortage of Police Officers due to recruitment and retention issues. Speed watch is now happening in conjunction with Go Safe and is proving successful in reducing instances of speeding.

Llandow is fed from Wick exchange and was completed via the Fibre Community Partnership. Llysworney and Sigingstone are fed from Cowbridge exchange and were built under the Openreach commercial program. Residents in each area can check the services available to them on the website Fibre Checker and for anybody that is not currently FTTP enabled there's an option to register for updates.
