39/20. DECLARATIONS OF PECUNIARY INTEREST, ETC:

Cllr. A. Pattinson declared an interest in all matters concerning the planning applications for Glebe Field Barn and The Gables, Llandow.

40/20. MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETINGS:

It was agreed to accept the minutes of the meeting held on 6th February 2020. Proposed by Cllr. A.Pattinson, seconded by Cllr. R. Thomas.

41/20. POLICE REPORT:

PCSO A. Stone conveyed (by email) that no crime had been reported in the preceding two months.

42/20. MATTERS ARISING:

Darren Farm Development & Weight Limit through Llysworney: It was reported that the weight limit signs are currently being installed.

Matters concerning Nash Junction are ongoing and Cllr. C. Cave is in regular contact with the Officers concerned. Cllr. R. Thomas identified the land which was purchased for the expansion of the junction from the map provided to Cllr. Cave by Mr. M. Clogg.

Water running off field at East View: Cllr. A. Cave reported that this problem had not recurred during the summer; however, a considerable amount of damage had been done to the road surface with several motorists damaging their vehicles. Cllr. Cave had been in touch with Mr. Clogg about this and was awaiting a response.

Road near the Place for Homes: Cllr. R. Thomas reported that the road is still sinking near 'The Place for Homes'. The Clerk will report this matter again to the VGCBC.

Cllr. C. Cave was delighted to report that Llandow Village Hall has successfully secured twenty thousand pounds of grant funding from the Strong Communities Fund to replace the roof.

Applications:

- 1.) Glebe Field Barn, Heol y Nant, Llandow: Proposed alterations and extension to existing stable block including a 20m x 40m Manege.
- 2.) The Gables Llandow: First floor side extension.

- 1.) Huckleberry, Llysworney: 6ft boundary privacy fence.
- 2.) Barns adjacent to Leechmere Farm, B4265 Wick Road, Llandow: Change of use of derelict barns into two holiday let accommodations.

49/20. LLANDOW:

Siteserve: Cllr. R. Thomas reported that several residents had complained to him about the operation of Siteserve and particularly the mess left by the most recent fire. The race track and caravan park are very near and visitors comment about the appalling appearance of the area. Cllr. C. Cave commented that this is an ongoing saga of which is she is fully aware, and spending a great deal of time requesting action is taken by NRW and the VGCBC against Siteserve for the continuing failure to meet their obligations.

Speeding in the Village: Cllr. A. Pattinson reported that she and Cllr. Newman had met with PCSO A. Stone to discuss the issues of speeding in the village and had discussed the 'Speed Watch Programme'; however, this is currently on hold due to the Covid 19 pandemic. It was noted the Welsh Government is currently considering a national policy regarding 20mph limits in built up areas. It is hoped this may be of particular benefit in the villages of the rural Vale.

Obscured speed limit sign near Rectory Cross: Cllr. A. Pattinson reported that the 30mph sign near Rectory Cross had been obscured by foliage. Cllr. Pattinson had reported this to the VGCBC some 8 weeks previously, but to date, no action had been taken. It was agreed the Clerk would write to the VGCBC about this matter.

Mirror at Nash Junction: Cllr. A. Pattinson reminded Members of Mr. Cloggs' undertaking to investigate the installation of a mirror at Nash Junction. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to Mr. Clogg and ask for an update.

Llandow Village Playground: Cllr. A. Pattinson reported (by email) that when it was announced that children's play areas would re-open in August of this year, she had been in touch with Mr. W. Hughes of the VGCBC department for play and recreational areas to request a comprehensive safety inspection and removal of the leaf litter that had accumulated over the preceding months. He was delightful as always and outlined the timing and scope of the work to be undertaken. It was so refreshing to find that everything discussed was completed by the specified date and to a high standard. The Clerk will write to Mr. Hughes to convey the appreciation of Council.

50/20. LLYSWORNEY:

Milestone: The milestone in the centre of the village had been damaged. It has been removed for repair but has not been reinstated. It was agreed the Clerk would ask Mr. M. Clogg for an update.

There were no items to report.

Council noted the report of Cllr. C. Cave (Appendix 2).

Boundary Commission: Cllr. C. Cave gave a brief overview of the proposals of the Boundary Commission in regard of the County Borough Council Llandow/ Ewenny ward. It was agreed to agenda this item for discussion at the next meeting.

To visit a recycling centre in the Vale of Glamorgan, you will need to book an appointment online.

Any residents visiting one of our recycling centres must comply with the current Government guidance and adhere to the social distancing measures that are in place, this is to ensure safe operation and use of the recycling centres.

Please note: We are unable to provide assistance with lifting or sorting, so please ensure all waste and recycling is manageable.

The following is in place:

- One appointment per household, per 30 day period.
- Only cars are permitted access. Unfortunately, we are unable to provide access or appointments for trailers or vans at this time.
- Before visiting, residents must sort their waste or recycling appropriately to minimise the time at the site.
- Residents must display their confirmation email and proof of residency e.g. driving licence or utility bill, in their windscreen whilst waiting to enter the site.
- Residents must follow on-site safety signs and guidance.
- Residents should only exit their car when advised to do so by a member of site staff.
