Cllr. C. Cave reported that she had again asked for an update regarding the re-location of the Civic Amenity Site at Llandow. A report will be going to Cabinet imminently and we await a further update in due course. Cllr. C. Cave reported that following complaints of mud on the roads from construction work, the Vale Council had responded quickly and the issue had been resolved.

Cllr. C. Cave reported that the recent heavy rain just before Christmas had caused several homes at Dinas Powys to be flooded. Cllrs. A and C. Cave had visited and helped residents with the clean-up.

a) *Colwinston Church in Wales Primary School Governorship*: Cllr. A Clarke reported that the four-year rolling Minor Authority Governor Position at St. David's School is due for renewal in February, having been with Colwinston Community Council since February 2017.
