PCSO Stone reported that there had been two crimes reported since the March meeting:

PCSO Stone circulated a guide to garden safety and recommend that residents took extra care that outbuildings and equipment are secure.

PCSO Stone reported that fly tipping had recently increased and that a caravan seemed to have been abandoned on the Pen y Bryn / Llanmaes Road. These matters had been reported to the VGCBC for action.

PCSO Stone reported that she had met with Cllr. C. Cave to discuss the ongoing problem with rouge traders going door-to-door in the locality. There is a concern as they seem to target vulnerable members of the community. People are encouraged to report any instances of 'cold calling' directly to the Police using the 101 telephone number.

PCSO Stone reported that she plans to hold a surgery in the near future, and everyone is welcome.
